

Q1 What are the TOP THREE (3) issues affecting children and families in Jefferson County? Check three from the list below.




Q5 School Success: Please select TOP THREE (3) issues that you think are the biggest issues or concerns related to school success of children and youth in Jefferson County.






Q8 Poverty: Please select THREE TOP (3) issues that you think are the biggest issues or concerns related to the Economic Security of children and families in Jefferson County.


