Definition

Autism is a complex developmental disability that typically appears during the first three years of life. It is the result of a neurological disorder that affects the normal functioning of the brain, impacting development in the areas of social interaction, behavior and communication skills.

ADMH AUTISM SERVICES



Intensive Care Coordination:

Identification, coordination, and monitoring of an array of supports through needs assessment, case planning, service arrangement, social support, re-assessment, and follow-up/monitoring by a single case manager.



Behavior Support:

Development and monitoring of a behavior support plan designed to diminish, extinguish, or improve specific behaviors. The behavior therapist coordinates and trains others to implement the plan as well as provide crisis management.



Therapeutic Mentoring:

Support, coaching, and training for an individual in age-appropriate behaviors, interpersonal communication, problem solving, conflict resolution, and relating appropriately to peers and adults.



In-Home Therapy:

Treatment of the individual's behavioral and mental health needs, to include effective support to enhance the family's ability to improve the individual's functioning in the home and community.



Peer Support:

Promotion of socialization, self-advocacy, development of natural supports, and maintenance of community living skills. Peer specialists encourage participation in service planning, engaging supports, improving self-management, decision making, and navigating child-serving agencies.



Psychoeducational Services:

Training to help individuals and families understand nature of diagnosis and effective strategies to maintain meaningful engagement in the community.

■To foster strong connections and collaborations between individuals and families directly affected by Autism Spectrum Disorder, professionals and providers, and the community to promote quality of life and enrich the fabric of society for all.

UAB Regional Autism Network Work Procedures and Processes

- Check voicemail and UAB RAN email daily
- Fill out the intake form based on voicemail or email information
- Return all correspondence within 3-5 business days is desired.
- Regularly update resources based on direct assistance needs

- Update resources on a monthly or every other month basis
- Note common themes in calls and emails on a monthly or every other month basis
- Discuss current and emerging issues with staff
- Strategize ways to meet community needs within available resources

WHAT WE DO

- Provide community members with general information about Autism.
- Guide clients (calls & emails to resources available to meet individualized needs.
- Assist with problem-solving for individuals, families, and professionals who work with individuals with autism.
- Provide opportunities for training and consultations to parents and professionals that are specific to the needs identified in the region by utilizing the collective expertise of various departments and programs at our UCEDD|LEND and surrounding resources.

- Identify and promote development of programs that are under-represented in the region, to benefit individuals with autism.
- Provide information about Best Practice Standards developed and endorsed by the Alabama Interagency Coordinating Council (AIACC).

WHAT WE DO SIMPLY PUT

- Information and Referral
- Technical Assistance and consultation
- Public Education and Professional Training

- The RAN does not have "clients" as we are not direct service providers, but rather an agency supporting the Autism system of care.
- Direct correspondence is offered to caregivers, while individuals working with the Autism population receive technical assistance and consultation.

■ The UAB RAN's main purpose is to support the Autism system of care, rather than providing direct services.

Professional Training

- Individual agencies and on-campus departments that work with the Autism population can receive professional training programs.
- The training programs focus on educating agencies and departments on how to fulfill their roles concerning Autism.
- **■** Each training is customized to meet the specific needs of the requesting agency or provider.
- The UAB RAN may collaborate with other professionals from the university or community who have expertise in the required topic.

- Professional trainings are not conducted daily but are scheduled upon request.
- Before professional training, certain tasks need to be completed.
- The tasks are necessary preparations for the training session.

- The completion of these tasks ensures a successful training session.
- The tasks are specific to each training and may vary depending on the topic and requirements.
- The purpose of these tasks is to ensure that the training is effective and meets the needs of the agency or provider.
